Construction Update

Summer 2021, contractors for the City of Fort Myers started Phase I construction of the First Street and Second Street Two-Way Traffic Conversion Project. Phase I will convert First, Second and Seaboard streets from one-way to two-way traffic to produce positive safety benefits quickly & efficiently. Work is expected to occur Monday through Friday from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.; however, some night and weekend work may be necessary. This project is expected to be completed in summer 2022.

Crews continue to install drill shafts for the the future traffic signal mast arms at varying intersections.

Palm Beach Boulevard and Seaboard Street intersection

Motorists should expect the inside westbound lane to remain closed from Seaboard Street to E. Riverside Drive. Once the traffic converts to two-way traffic, this lane will be the left turn lane onto Seaboard Street.

First Street - Motorists should expect lane closures from Fowler Street to Cranford Avenue through the end of May.

Second Street

- **Beginning Monday, 1/24 after the morning peak traffic**, motorists should expect a traffic pattern change on Second Street at the Park Avenue intersection. Second Street traffic will be reduced to one left turn lane onto Park Avenue and one through lane. These lane closures will remain in place **until further notice**.
- Motorists should expect lane closures from Fowler Street to Palm Avenue through the end of May.
